Some things to note

Google Passwords – We have recently worked with our IT provider to ensure all of the children are set up with their Google accounts and passwords for use both at home and at school. News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

In Phonics this week, Foundation Stage has learnt the new sounds represented by the digraph "oo". This digraph has the long oo sound, as in moon, but can also be the short oo sound as in look and book. If we are not sure which sound to say, you have to try them both and see which one makes more sense. We have also revised the Tricky Words her & they.

In Literacy we have listened to the story "I want my hat back". We loved this funny story and liked the way the ending leaves you unsure about what happened. We have modelled the words that the bear said and have written speech bubbles to show his words.

In Maths we have finished off our work on 9 and 10, by reminding ourselves about double numbers and odd and even numbers.

We also practised our assembly, which we hope you were able to come and watch. We all enjoyed taking part and the FS Staff said it was the best that we had ever done it! This is why the Gold award has gone to the Whole Class for our excellent performance.

The Reading Eggs programme has been provided by the school for us to use at home. You can access it via this website. Your individual login is in the front of the orange Home Reading Record book.

Year One

This week in English we have completed our information book about Spring. We have written some amazing information and used some super vocabulary. This week we have also added pictures and learnt about the differences between labels and captions.

In phonics we have been learning ge (as in charge/large) and o (making the uh sound as in mother). Our focus words have been, asked and could. We have also been busy reading the first 100 high frequency words. This list of words was sent home at Parents Evening and it is great to know that lots of you are practicing reading and spelling these words with your children. If you have misplaced the list, please ask me for another!

We have been using the words longer, shorter and taller and we all have a good understanding of this vocabulary. We have been comparing the height and length of objects and we have been learning how to use a ruler to measure objects in cm. We have also been continuing to partition numbers and have been practicing counting in 2's, 5's and 10's.

Our new History topic is 'Significant Queens' and we have enjoyed learning about Queen Elizabeth 1st and Queen Victoria. We put these queens on our class timeline. We learnt about their lives and about what life was like when they were on the throne. We enjoyed this information:

In PSHE we have been thinking about how it makes us feel when we are kind and helpful. We also thought about how the recipient of our kindness would feel. It was really nice to hear about all the lovely things the children have bene doing at home to show their kindness.

Year Two

In Phonics, we have been learning to read and spell words with the sound 'j': 'j' as in jelly, 'g' as in giant, 'ge' as in garage and 'dge' as in hedge. In Guided Reading, we have enjoyed the story 'If I was a kid aboard the Titanic'. This book is a mix of fiction and fact, describing the journey experienced by two fictional children and their voyage on the Titanic. We have explored vocabulary and retrieval skills. In English, we have written our own information text about the Titanic. We have learned to write an introduction and to organise our writing using sub-headings. Our texts will become a book for our book corner in class.

In Guided Maths, we have been learning to count, sequence and recognise patterns with multiples of 10. In Maths, we completed our Length and Height learning and have begun learning about Mass, Capacity and Temperature. We have explored the vocabulary heavier and lighter and compared the mass of objects.

In History, we have learned why so many people died when the Titanic hit an iceberg and we have discussed whether Captain Edward Smith was a hero or not. We recognised that the facts we have learned come from eyewitnesses who might tell the same story differently. In PSHE, we learned why we do not share personal information online. In Computing, we learned what an attribute is and how we can use attributes to sort people. We decided to sort people according to their favourite subject, then we created a tally chart and found out which school subjects were most popular in Year 2. In RE, we learned about the story of Ganesh and why this story is important to Hindus. In PE, we created a dance using an 8 beat rhythm and we performed the dance to each other.

Year Three

In English this week, we have been learning about William Shakespeare and the play 'Romeo and Juliet'. To help us understand the story we drew a story map of Romeo and Juliet and looked at the relationships between all the characters. Once we were familiar with the play, we worked in groups and had great fun roleplaying the story which the children then presented to the rest of the class. We ended the week by looking at the key features of a play script in preparation for writing our own play scripts next week.

In guided reading, we have finished reading 'The Iron Man'. This week we have discussed whether Hogarth made the right decision in leading the Iron Man to the scrap metal yard and the impact it had on the farmers. We have drawn a picture of the dragon that arrives on earth using the description in the book and used our inference and retrieval skills to answer comprehension questions.

This week in Maths, we have completed our unit about mass and capacity. We have been learning about equivalent masses (kg and g), and how to convert from one unit to the other. We then compared the two units before learning how to add and subtract them. We finished the week by learning about capacity and volume, and how to measure in millilitres and litres. In Computing, we continued learning about branching databases. This week, we created a plan for our data, which we will be making, in the following lesson. For our planning, we identified different attributes, which we could use to differentiate between our animals.

In History, we have been exploring the Anglo Saxons. We have learnt about archaeologists and looked closely at some of the artefacts found at Sutton Hoo. We have also used timelines and maps to help us learn more about the Anglo Saxons and wrote our names using the Ogham alphabet. In PSHE, we concluded our lesson about why some people may have to leave their homes. This week, we watched a video called 'The journey' which is a book written by Francesca Sanna. We then discussed the story and identified how the family might have felt leaving their home. We then wrote different ways of how we would make the family feel welcomed into our community. In PE, we concluded our learning about dance and the ocean. We linked different dance styles attributed to the different layers of the ocean. We also included dance moves showing how the ocean becomes polluted and what we could do to help.

Year Four

In English this week, we have been working on persuasive writing. We have focused on writing persuasive letters to persuade Sam not to bully Davey. To make our letters more effective, we have learned to structure our writing into paragraphs and incorporate powerful adjectives in expanded noun phrases. By using these techniques, we hoped to persuade Sam to change his behaviour. Additionally, we made an effort to extend our persuasive sentences by using coordinating and subordinating conjunctions.

Our maths lessons have continued to explore the topic of fractions. We have discovered equivalent fractions by using a fraction wall and bar models, which has helped us visualise the connection between different fractions. We also practiced adding two or more fractions using bar models, as well as adding fractions and mixed numbers. To further develop our understanding, we have begun subtracting fractions with the same denominator, as well as subtracting fractions from whole numbers.

In our history lessons, we embarked on an exciting journey to Ancient Greece. We began by learning about who the Ancient Greeks were and their significance in world history. As part of our exploration, we examined various Greek artefacts, such as pots and buildings, and contemplated the valuable insights they provide about the ancient Greek civilization. Our PSHE lessons this

week have focused on understanding and responding to allergic reactions. We learned about the appropriate steps to take when someone is experiencing an allergic reaction. During our PE lessons, we engaged in lively small-sided games of handball. This week, we concentrated on applying the 7-metre penalty rule.

In our Spanish lessons, we explored the vibrant country of Chile. We delved into its culture, language, and traditions, allowing us to gain a deeper understanding of this Spanish-speaking nation. As part of our learning, we created an engaging fact file about Chile, highlighting its unique features and contributions to the wider world. Finally, in RE, we turned our attention to Hindu religious texts. We investigated how these texts are used and understood by Hindus. Through our study, we gained insight into the significance of these texts and their influence on Hindu practices and beliefs.

Year Five

In English this week, we have planned, drafted, improved and published our own alternative endings to Philip Pullman's gothic fairy tale 'Clockwork'. Mrs PC has been left slightly traumatised by some of our shocking (and sometimes gory ideas) but is very pleased this challenge made our imaginations go wild! Of course, apart from composing an entertaining piece of writing we were also reminded to include clear and accurate sentences, direct speech and integrated setting & character descriptions where needed. We also tried to include modal verbs, relative clauses, expanded noun phrases and parenthesis – all key objectives for Year 5 writing. In Guided Reading sessions, we read the opening chapters of Onjali Q Raúf's novel 'A Star Outside my Window'. This deals with some of the devastating effects of physical and emotional abuse within the home leading to some very sensitive whole-class discussions.

In History, we have continued our journey through prehistory and 'travelled' through the Mesolithic Stone Age, Neolithic Stone Age and the Bronze Age. We have enjoyed learning how life changed and about the advantages of the discovery of a new metal alloy made from copper and tin. In Spanish, we have begun researching a Hispanic country and will use this to produce a poster to share with everyone at next Tuesday's Hispanic Evening (7-8 p.m.).

In Maths, we have continued our decimals learning. First, we rounded decimals to the nearest whole number, then to the nearest tenth (or to 1 decimal place). After this, we linked our fraction and decimal learning to percentages starting to understand how these may all be related. Year Six

In English we have completed publishing our final versions of our narrative based on an AI character and their friendship with their human owner. In Spellings we have reviewed word with a /shun/ ending. We have explored how the sound /shun/ is the result of the suffixes -ion and -ian occurring after root words ending in 't', 's', 'ss' or 'c'. In Guided Reading we have been looking at the reading papers that we completed during the previous week.

In Maths, we have continued our learning on fractions, decimal and percentages. We have converted fractions to percentages and found that if we converted the fraction to an equivalent fraction with a denominator of 100, then it made it much easier to work out the percentage. We have also found equivalent fractions, decimals and percentage eq 1/5 = 20% = 0.2. We then applied this maths skill to a range of fractions, decimals and percentages so that we could order and compare them. We have also calculated percentages of amounts such as 45% of 500. In History we have been learning about the ancient civilisation of the Maya. We have researched 4 main questions – Who were the ancient Maya people? When did they live? Where did they live? How did they live? - creating mind maps with all the information that we found. We looked at the location of the Maya, marking the 7 countries and some of the Maya city states on a map. We learnt about the explorers John Lloyd Stephens and Frederick Stephens who discovered some of the Maya lost cities. We examined some of the amazing drawings that Stephen made of the ruins and artefacts and used then to inspire us to write a diary entry of when they found the ruins. We have also looked at a range of artefacts and thought about what they tell us about the Maya. In PSHE we have discussed how to stay safe online and online fraud, focusing on identifying online fraud in different contexts, including through websites and online gaming. We also explored the risks of sharing personal information online and learnt how to protect our identity. In our

Computing lesson on spreadsheets we used the skills we have developed over the last few weeks to plan an event, using formulas to calculate the costs. In Music we rehearsed all the songs we have performed so far and included a range of instruments to accompany these songs. This week we have enjoyed the music of the Brian Setzer Orchestra. Website
