News from the classes this week: Foundation Stage

In Phonics this week, Foundation Stage has been learning to read and write the sounds m & d. We have also been reading the Common Exception Words (Tricky Words) the & I. In Literacy, we have continued enjoying the story of 'Handa's Surprise' by Eileen Browne. We have mapped out the story and have used our phonic sounds to label a diagram of Handa's fruit.

We have continued our Maths learning on matching, sorting and comparing. We have sorted the buttons into groups and have played "Guess My Rule". This is where one person sorts the buttons and the other person has to work out the rule used for sorting. For example, they might have been sorted by colour, size, or shape.

The adults have looked at our Sound Books that we have been working on at home. They are pleased with our progress and are especially pleased to see that most children have worked really well on the handwriting part.

The Reading Eggs programme has been provided by the school for us to use at home. Miss Harris was very happy to see that lots of us have already made progress here. Keep up the good work!

Year One

In English this week, we have been busy retelling the story of 'The Magic Porridge Pot'. We started the week by sequencing pictures to retell the story. We then wrote the beginning, the middle and the end of the story. We enjoyed sharing these stories with Year 3 in our paired reading session.

In our guided reading lessons, we have loved 'Space Tortoise' by Ross Montgomery and David Litchfield. This is a super story that the children loved. It was lovely to find out that some of the children actually went home and researched all about animals in space. We were very glad that this story had a happy ending.

In phonics, we have been focussing on y as in happy and ey as in donkey. We have been reading and spelling words with these sounds. We have also been learning how to read and spell out/like. The children have enjoyed playing the buried treasure game on this website:

In Maths, we have been ordering numbers. We spent one of our lessons in the ICT suite. Below is the link to the game we played to support our learning. The children were keen to share it with you so that they can play it at home too.

Select the order option and then order numbers 1-10 forwards (you could try 1-20 or higher for a challenge!). We have also been using a number line and filling in missing number on a number line.

Our new History unit is 'Intrepid Explorers'. This week we have learnt what an explorer is, where they go and what they might need to take with them. We also answered this question 'Do you think that being an explorer is a dangerous job?' Please ask your children this question as they had some great answers.

In Computing, we have been focussing on our mouse control skills. This game is a good website that will support mouse skills:

Just a reminder that we will be walking to Flackwell Heath library on Monday. Could I also remind you to name everything? This week we have been trying to reunite children with unnamed jumpers!

Year Two

In Phonics, we have been learning to recognise, read and write homophones (words that sound the same but are spelled differently and have different meanings). Some of these are: pier and peer, see and sea, whether and weather etc. It would be useful to look for homophones when reading at home. Which homophones did you find? In Guided Reading, we finished reading 'Woolf' by Alex Latimer. We used wondering and prediction skills to explore the text and used visualisation to draw the pack of wolves using the vocabulary clues from the story. We also used retrieval to answer questions about the story. In English, we have written a set of instructions for George to help him to make a marvellous medicine. We used command sentences, imperative verbs and numbered steps to tell George what to do.

In Guided Maths, we have explored different ways of partitioning the number eight e.g. 1 + 7, 2 + 6, 3 + 5, 4 + 4, 8 + 0 and the reverse of these. In Maths, we began a new unit of learning on addition and subtraction. We have explored number bonds to 10 and 20, as well as fact families such as 3+7=10, 7+3=10, 10=7+3, 10=3+7 and 10-7=3, 10-3=7, 3=10-7, 7=10-3. These fact families were quite tricky for many children, so further practise will be needed.

In Science, we investigated which materials were absorbent and why we change materials. In Computing, we considered the types of IT used in shops and in PE we created sequences of balances, including different ways of travelling. https://readingeggs.co.uk/

Year Three

This week in English, we have been writing a recount from a character's perspective. We started the week by planning our writing. For this, we had to answer questions grouped into paragraphs and then responded to marking comments. We then wrote our recounts from a character's perspective, including all of the features we have been learning about. We then edited and published our writing, and then read it out to an audience.

In Maths, we have started learning about addition and subtraction. This week, we have been learning how to apply number bonds within 10 and using manipulatives and other maths resources to support us with our work. We have also been learning how to add and subtract 1s, 10s and 100s from a given number.

In Topic, we have started learning about History and the Romans. We have been learning about who the Romans were and where they came from. We have also learnt about why they arrived and invaded Britain. To conclude our learning about the Romans this week, we have learnt about why their army was so successful. In PSHCE, we have continued learning about relationships and this week, we learnt about how to make new friendships. In Computing, we learnt about networks and servers, and explored how computers are connected. In Spanish, we have been learning our numbers up to 10.

Year Four

We have continued with our work with 'The Spiderwick Chronicles' during our English lessons this week. We have read about the nest that the Grace children find behind the wall, and written paragraphs to describe this setting. We had to remember to use the expanded noun phrases that we have been learning about over the last couple of weeks. We have also started learning about non-chronological reports by reading different examples of them and finding out their audience and purpose.

During our maths lessons, we have finished off our work with place value. We have been ordering four-digit numbers in ascending and descending order, by comparing the place value of the digits. We have learned about Roman numerals and compared these to our own number system. We have also used our knowledge of number lines to round numbers to the nearest 10 and nearest 100.

In our PSHE lesson, we started thinking about resilience; how it can be recognised and developed. During our computing lesson, we thought about who owns different websites and is responsible for the content on them. In our PE lessons, we practised our dribbling skills in football, and worked in a group of four to create gymnastics sequences. During our history lessons, we started our new topic 'The Vikings'. We recapped our learning from year three about this topic and learned what life was like in Britain before the first Viking invasions. We learned who the Vikings were, where they came from and the journeys they took around the world in the 8th to 11th centuries. We also found out what values the Norsemen held, and how this motivated them.

Year Five

In Maths, we are continuing to focus on Addition and Subtraction. We have revised adding and subtracting two 4-digit numbers and explaining when we may need to make an exchange. We then progressed to adding and subtracting numbers with more than 4-digits using the formal column method. We have explored inverse calculations linked to addition and subtractions and have challenged ourselves to solve worded, multi-step problems. In Spelling lessons this week, we have been focussing on the tricky *-ough* letter string and have grouped words together according to how they are pronounced. In English, we have planned, drafted, edited and improved our first piece of independent writing this year – a balanced argument: Should David and Tucky tell the truth? This links to our class novel: `Friend or Foe' by Michael Morpurgo, which we have used in Guided Reading sessions to practise our inference and prediction skills.

In our new History unit, we have been learning about the events leading up to Britain's involvement in WWII and the Battle of Britain. We listened to two wartime British Prime Minister's famous speeches linked to the declaration of war (Neville Chamberlain) and The Battle of Britain (Winston Churchill), which were broadcast over the wireless (radio) in 1939 and 1940. In RE, we continued our learning about marriage and why people may choose to have a religious or non-religious ceremony. In PSHE, we continued our learning

around the risks and impact of stereotyping. We really impressed Mrs PC with our teamwork in our Gymnastics PE lesson, where we worked in pairs to create artistic and interesting transitions for our counter balances. In Spanish, we have extended our weather knowledge by drafting a Spanish weather forecast including compass directions. Year Six

In English and Guided Reading this week, we have been reading a chapter from 'Boy – Tales of Childhood' by Roald Dahl called 'The Great Mouse Plot'. In this chapter, Roald Dahl and his school friends find a dead mouse and get their revenge on Mrs Pratchett (the loathsome sweet shop owner) by putting the dead mouse in the gobstopper jar. We have used this chapter to write our own recount of the event from Mrs Pratchett's point of view. We have also planned and written our own sweet stories – taking some of our favourite sweets and describing how they are made with a disgusting ingredient so that it puts people off eating them. In Spellings, we have been looking at 'ie' and 'ei' words with the /ee/ sound, using the pattern 'i' before 'e' except after 'c'.

In Maths, we have continued our learning on addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We used square and cubed numbers, multiplied 4 digit numbers by 2 digit numbers and used a range of mental strategies to solve multiplication problems. In our History unit. We have started to explore the ancient Egyptian civilisation. We have thought about what we already know and looked at a timeline to see where the ancient Egyptians sit in relation to other ancient civilisations. We have thought about how historians have discovered facts about this era and have learnt about Howard Carter's discovery of the tomb of Tutankhamun. We have then written a diary entry based on this discovery as Howard Carter. In PSHE, we have continued to discuss the changes and challenges in life that can impact on our mental health. In RE, we have researched the world-view of Humanism. We found out its origins, what they believe and how humanists live their lives. We even discovered that our school scientist of the term - Rosalind Franklin, although a follower of Jewish traditions – was a humanist. In Computing, we have worked collaboratively on the same document whilst at different computers. This week in class, we have been listening to the music of Guns N Roses.
