| 5 | Site Security If the school site is not secure visitors/intruders could come onto the site. Inappropriate materials could be circulated to parents or pupils by those on site or at the school entrances. | The school site is secure and is regularly checked by the caretaker. Gates are secured at 8.55 and not unlocked until the end of the school day. All legitimate visitors to the school are given a lanyard to identify them as such and this is worn whilst they are on site. Entry to the site is via the main entrance and all visitors are required to sign in and out. Staff on duty at the entrances to the school would challenge anyone handing out materials and request that these be handed into the school office so that their suitability can be checked. From time to time leaflets are distributed by the school to parents. These are generally for activities that pupils may be interested in for example, dance, sporting clubs or holiday activities.
