School Updates

Visits and visitors

Year 4 and 5 have visited the church and worked on the river clean up at Kingsmead.

Year 5 also completed a diversity workshop and an e safety talk.

Various sports events have taken place including golf, tennis, football, netball and cricket. Jean asked if it could be made clear to the children how people were selected as there seemed to be some concerns around this.

Academy Update

The diocese trust have been completing due diligence, assessing teaching and learning and behaviour and welfare. These areas were found to be outstanding. The due diligence process is ongoing.

Governor Update

The governors continue to work through our Multi Academy Trust application and due diligence process. There has been a lot of work carried out by the Oxford Diocese Bucks Schools Trust (ODBST) in regards to reviewing the school's education provision, budget and future predictions.

A full board meeting has been held. The Governing Board review several aspects of the school through the Head teacher's report, where Governors ask pertinent question around the report as well as completing a SOAR analysis (strengths, opportunities, aspirations and results). We also reviewed the ODBST report following the day that they had spent in school, part of this process also involved the ODBST challenging the Governors on their knowledge of the school.

Curriculum and finance and governor self-evaluation meetings upcoming.

New Ofsted framework to be discussed.

Paul mentioned how pleased both the governors and school are with the new FOLS committee and the relationship between all parties.

AOB – Feedback from class representatives/others at the meeting

School uniform

Parents continue to raise concerns around school uniform. The quality with myclothing is still not as good as PMG and sizing remains a concern. PMG have been difficult with some parents who have tried to order goods – some staff report that they no longer sell our uniform and others have been told it's a 6-8 week order time. Mrs Cunnington will talk to PMG to see if they will stock the PE T Shirts. It was generally agreed that parents would be happier paying a little more for better quality.

Communication

Issues with communication were raised – Kew Gardens was used as an example. Confusion around what children could wear – teachers were telling children something different to the messages being sent out. Change of timings was understood but the initial message did not take into account registration. It was felt that communication needed to be clearer to avoid the need for multiple messages.

Timings for sports day and the summer fete were also an issue – parents need some notice around timings for time off / planning the weekend. Mrs Cunnington will look into this.
