Christmas Lunch Orders

News from the classes this week:

Foundation Stage

In Phonics this week, Foundation Stage has been learning to read and write the sounds f and l. We have also noticed that these letters can be seen as doubles as in the words "off" and "mill", although we just say one sound. We will be looking at more double letters next week. We have been reading and writing the Common Exception Word (Tricky Word) "go".

In Literacy, we have continued to enjoy the story of 'The Tiger who Came to Tea'. We have made shopping lists for Sophie, so that she can replace the food that the tiger ate. The tiger that came to our classroom has eaten all the food and run away, so we have made Wanted Posters so that people can know he is missing and can keep an eye out for him. We have also been reading and learning about real tigers.

Our Maths learning has focused on ways of making 4 and 5. We have used 4 shells to show ways of making 4, and counters on a 5 frame to help us to find numbers that add together to make 5.

In Art, we have worked together as a class to make a sculpture. It was inspired by Michelle Readers sculpture of a Jaguar, made from recycled parts. Because we have been learning about tigers we decided that we would make a tiger sculpture. Here is a picture of the Jaguar sculpture,



and one of our tiger sculpture.

Year One

We have been continuing to enjoy 'Where the wild things are'. This week we have been sequencing the story and writing sentences in the role of Max. We wrote sentences to match pictures from the story and wrote a letter to Mum telling her all the things we had done on our adventure. We were sad to complete this story but are looking forward to our new text next week.

In phonics, we have been focussing on reading and spelling word with er (as in herbs, expert) and ir (as in bird and shirt). The tricky words we have been reading and spelling have been asked and could. We have also been working on making sure our handwriting is neat and our letters are correctly formed.

Please continue to use Reading Eggs; it has been great to see a few more of you making the most of this great resource. Keep it up!

In Maths this week, we have been finding a missing part in subtraction number sentences. This was tricky but we used a part whole model to help us. In our guided Maths lessons, we have been focussing on finding doubles of numbers up to 10. We used our fingers, dice and 10 frames to help us. A quick recall of doubles is an essential skill and this website can be used to help practice doubling

Select the doubles option and then up to 10. Please continue to use this game to practice number bonds to 10 too.

This week in Geography, we have been finding out more information about what it is like in Antarctica. We focussed on the wildlife that might be found there as well as the features such as volcanoes and mountains. We have also been comparing Loudwater to Antarctica; this was very interesting.

It is all about the nature in Antarctica but there are some parts, which might make uncomfortable viewing so you might want to watch this before you, share it with your children.

Year Two

In Phonics, we have revised the sounds 'oo' as in look, 'u' as in push, 'oul' as in could, 'ar' as in hard, 'a' as in father and 'al' as in calf. In Guided Reading, we have continued to enjoy the story 'Ossiri and the Bala Mengro'. We have used prediction, inference, retrieval and summary to show our understanding of the story. In English, we began the story 'The Man Who Wore All His Clothes' by Allan Ahlberg. We used the reading skills of prediction, retrieval and visualisation to explore the characters in the story. Using the vocabulary given in the text, we created a wanted poster to describe the character of the robber.

In Guided Maths, we have learned about the position of the numbers 5, 10 and 15 on a number line to 20. We explored how this knowledge helps us to predict the length of items between 0-20cm. In Maths, we have used lines of symmetry to draw the other half of shapes, sorted 2D shapes and counted faces, edges and vertices on 3D shapes.

In PSHE, we created a poster to help people to identify bullying behaviours. In Geography, we learned about the reasons why people might like to visit the coastal areas of Cornwall and Rio de Janeiro. In Computing, we learned what makes a good photo e.g. object central to the screen, zooming in to the subject and choosing portrait or landscape. In RE, we learned about special objects in Hinduism. In PE, we created a dance sequence to represent Penguin Small travelling across the ocean.

This week, I have given the children a paper-based Maths task for home learning. This does not need to be sent back into school. Thank you!

Year Three

This week in English, we have started learning from our new class text 'Traction Man is Here'. We have so far made inferences about a character based on a setting. We also revisited using third person language and wrote sentences about Traction Man. We also discussed some of the characters and used inference to write about what some characters are thinking based on their facial expressions, body language and previous knowledge from the text.

In Maths, we have started learning about multiplication and division. We have so far learnt about making equal groups. We used arrays and used double-sided counters to support us with our learning. We have also learnt about multiples of 2, 5 and 10, and we used our times table knowledge to help us complete our task. In RE, we have been learning about Islam and how Muslims worship. We watched a video and discussed some of its content. We also had some children from Year 6 who came up to share their experiences about how they worship. In PSHE, we have been learning about how we can stay safe at home. For this, we discussed some scenarios and ranked them according to how risky they are. In Geography, we have been comparing London to Paris. We discussed both cities and used description cards to identify some features for each city. We also discussed human and physical geography and then used an i-pad to research these facts. We then completed a Venn diagram to show some similarities and differences between both cities. In PE, we have learnt about passing into space for football and how to use props in dance. In Computing, we have been using a storyboard to plan our stories for our animation. We created the setting, the characters and the event.

Year Four

We have been writing a narrative using the text 'Odd and the Frost Giants' for our inspiration this week. We have re-told the story from a first-person perspective, thinking about how the story would change if we were Odd. We have tried hard to include lots of detail by using fronted adverbials and different sentence types with conjunctions. During our reading lessons, we have used 'The Firework-Maker's Daughter' to focus on our knowledge of vocabulary. We have found challenging words in the text and used dictionaries to look up the meanings of these words, to help us better understand the use of these words in the story. Our spelling focus this week has been learning words from the year four spelling list.

During our maths lessons, we have started our work on multiplication and division. We have recapped our three times tables from year 3 and thought about how this can help us with our 6 times tables. We have multiplied and divided numbers by 6 by using equipment such as double-sided counters. We have also practised our 6 times tables by counting up and down in multiples of 6s.

In our topic lessons, we have continued with our geography work on mountains. We have found out how different mountains are formed and the different mountain types such as fault-block mountains, fold mountains and plateau mountains. We then looked at volcanoes and learned how the two different types of volcanoes are formed. In our PSHE lesson, we learned about personal boundaries and how to treat others with respect. In our computing lesson, we used algorithms as loops to create shapes on turtle logo programming software. Year Five

In English this week, we began a new unit of work based around the narrative: 'The Promise' by Nicola Davies. We were intrigued by this story and have been very engaged in our linked activities. Mrs PC has challenged us to write our own narrative – a promise that makes an environmental difference at the end of this unit. We identified the features of this book and have built up a word-bank, full of expanded noun phrases and some simile ideas linked to extreme weather settings. In Guided Reading, we have loved listening to and reading 'The Night Gardener' and 'The Secret Sky Garden', where we have wondered and inferred. We have also been able to compare and contrast books we have read recently in both Guided Reading and English, and have identified and discussed common themes in the narratives.

In Maths, we have recognised equivalent fractions and practised converting mixed numbers to improper fractions and vice versa. To support our conversions, we have also discussed short division (bus stop method) which is something we will look at in more detail in the Spring Term. In PSHE, we discussed different relationships in our lives and how they compare or are different. This supported our final discussions on whether taking money without asking can ever be the right thing to do. In Spelling, we have focussed on the /shul/ sound, spelled -cial or -tial and practised using some of the more complex /shul/ words such as *substantial* or *residential*. Finally, we have been carrying out some Geography Fieldwork just before morning registration, where we check our rain gauges, thermometer and use an anemometer to measure wind speed. In our Geography lessons, we have considered how we can present weather data in a graph and used Microsoft Excel to produce a correctly labelled line graph or average temperatures and precipitation in High Wycombe.

Year Six

In Year 6, this week we have completed assessments in Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling, Reading and Maths.

In English this week we have been completing the final parts of the writing process for our explanation texts about the process of mummification inspired by the book – 'You wouldn't want to an Egyptian Mummy!' by David Stewart. First, we edited our writing. This is where we look at what we have written and think how we can improve it by re-writing sentences and improving the adjectives, verbs and adverbs. After that we proof-read our writing. This is where we check for errors such as spelling mistakes, missing words and missing punctuation. The final stage is to publish our writing, which we have started to do at the end of the week.

In Maths, we have continued our fractions learning by adding and subtracting mixed number fractions and solving multi-step problems involving fractions.

In our Geography unit, we have explored what challenges people living in 'slum' conditions face and how we can make sure there is enough food for everyone on earth. We have also started to think about whether we agree with the following statement – 'A lack of food is the biggest population challenge of our time?' In PSHE, we have looked at influences that might cause us to take drugs – both legal and illegal. In Music this week, we have learnt about arpeggios and syncopation. We listened to Ella Fitzgerald and Duke Ellington, learnt about scat singing and had a go at it ourselves. We did our best to improve our singing, trying to make it sound stylish, rhythmic and authentic. In our Computing unit – Web page creation – we have continued to look at the importance of copyright. This week in class, we have been listening to music of Queen. Website
