News from the classes this week: Foundation Stage

In Phonics this week, Foundation Stage has been learning to read and write the sounds p & n. Now that we know the sounds s,a,t,i,p & n, this means that we have many words that we can begin to read, like pan, pat, tin, nan.

In Literacy, we have been enjoying the story of 'Handa's Surprise' by Eileen Browne. Handa collected lots of different fruit for her friend Akeyo. We had heard of most of the fruits, but we hadn't tried them all. Miss Harris managed to find everything except a guava and so we had the chance to taste avocado, pineapple, banana, orange, passion fruit, mango and tangerine. Avocado wasn't so popular but most of us thought the other fruits were delicious. This also helped us to remember that it is a healthy choice to eat plenty of fruits and vegetables.

Our Maths learning has been focused on matching, sorting and comparing. We have used the button tray to help us with these activities and we will continue with this next week.

We will be working on our Sound Books next week, so please check that they are in bookbags. There will be a new Sound Book handed out on Friday, so after that you can keep Sound Book 1 at home.

We will also be sending home a login and password for the Reading Eggs programme for each child. This is a programme that reinforces the schools reading scheme and is free for you to use at home with the login details that we provide. Look out for the details in your child's book bag.

Year One

This week in English, we have continued to enjoy the story of 'The Magic Porridge Pot'. We have written some super descriptions of the old woman, focussing on her appearance. We have also been describing the porridge in terms of what it looked like and what it was doing. These are some of our super sentences:

- The hot porridge was bubbling.
 - The sticky porridge was cooking.

We enjoyed creating a story map to help us to retell the story and we made some puppets to help us too.

In phonics, we have been focussing on the sounds 'oe' as in toe and 'o' as in both. The words we have been focussing on are have and there. Please practice putting these in sentences as well as reading and spelling them. Please keep using Reading Eggs. The children will have the same log in as they used last year.

In Maths this week, we have been focussing on more than, less than and equal to. We have been comparing numbers using this vocabulary. We have also been using the greater than and less than symbols to compare numbers.

In Science, we have been investigating the properties of materials. We have been looking at materials that float and sink. We have also been investigating which material would make the best umbrella for a teddy. We predicted and then tested the materials We found out that plastic was the best material to use.

We have also been looking at how the weather changes with each season. We thought about which clothes match which season.

Home learning activity: this week we have been looking at conkers and conker shells. Please take some time to go collecting conkers with your children. It's such a lovely thing to do! If you are not sure where to find a horse chestnut tree please come and see me!

As explained in our Open House meeting, over the next 2 weeks we will be using the correct terminology to name the external genitalia of both girls and boys. If you have any questions about this please come and see me.

Year Two

In Phonics, we have been learning to read and write words with the sound 'oa': 'oa' as in goat, 'o-e' as in bone, 'oe' as in toe, 'o' as in go and 'ow' as in grow. In Guided Reading, we have begun reading the story 'Woolf' by Alex Latimer. We have made predictions and wonderings about the first few pages and answered retrieval questions about the text. In English, we read and followed instructions to make a grape caterpillar, then we sequenced the instructions and, finally, we had a go at writing our own instructions.

In Guided Maths, we have been learning to partition the number 6 in different ways. In Maths, we have focused on counting in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s (forwards and backwards). We have completed number lines and number tracks with missing numbers. Further practise of counting on and back in 5s and 3s would be very beneficial at home.

In PSHE, we considered what makes a good friend. In Science, we have investigated how we can change materials by bending, stretching, twisting and squashing them. We also investigated which material was the stretchiest! We made predictions and recorded our findings in different ways. In Computing, we explored different types of IT around the world and where we might find them e.g. speed cameras, cash registers and bank machines. In PE, we have learned to travel in different ways, including the camel walk, bunny hops and crab walk.

This week in English, we have been learning about different features of recount writing. We have learnt about using articles 'a' and 'an' and how to use them accurately in a sentence. We have also learnt about using 1st, 2nd and 3rd person pronouns to write from different perspectives. We have learnt about using speech marks correctly to write direct speeches as quotes. We have also learnt about writing in the past tense, using past tense vocabulary.

In Maths, we have been learning about estimating numbers on a number line. We have also been learning how to compare and order numbers up to 1000. In addition, we have learnt how to count in 50s by making links to our 5 times table.

In PSCHE, we have continued learning about friendships. This week, we have learnt when we should keep a secret and what makes a good friendship. In Computing, we have learnt about what parts make up a digital device. We have learnt how to write and send messages. In Science, we have continued learning about the human body. This week, we have been learning about muscles and why we need them. We have also been learning about how the human skeleton compares to other animals. We have learnt about the different types of skeletons and discussed the pros and cons for each type. Lastly, we have learnt about different food and nutrition and all the information food labels provide.

Year Four

During our English lessons this week, we have continued with our work using the text 'The Selfish Giant'. We have practised writing sentences with expanded noun phrases, thinking about how we can use a preposition with these. We have then used our learning about expanded noun phrases to write a descriptive paragraph about the giant's garden. We have also been planning our own stories about kindness ready to write next week. During our reading lessons, we have focused on wondering, asking questions and predicting from the text, using 'The Spiderwick Chronicles'.

During our maths lessons, we have continued with our work on place value. We have placed four-digit numbers on a number line and estimated where four-digit numbers would come on a number line to 10,000. We have also compared numbers up to 10,000 by looking at the place value of the digits.

In our science lessons, we have used our knowledge about human teeth to think about what different types of teeth animals need, depending upon whether they are herbivores, carnivores or omnivores. We have also been creating and describing food chains that are found in different habitats, using vocabulary such as producer, primary consumer and top predator.

In our PE lesson, we worked on gymnastics routines with different elements such as working at height and changes of speed and direction. In our computing lesson, we explored what information can be found on different types of websites. Year Five

In Guided Reading sessions this week, we have furthered our knowledge of Michael Morpurgo's novel: 'Friend or Foe'. We were introduced to Mr. Reynold's wife, Ann, and noted how the author cleverly reveals her personality through the description of her kitchen. In English lessons, we have learnt the 9 pure modal verbs and have practised identifying and using these. We have also studied the Present Perfect tense and found out how to form it and when it could be used. We have held two mini-debates and used both personal and impersonal opinion when recording our written responses. In Spellings this week, we completed our joint Y3/4 word list spelling bee – many congratulations to the winning table!

In Maths, we have been rounding numbers within 1,000,000; rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100, 1,000, 10,000 and 100,000. We have found it more challenging to promptly recall the 2 multiples of 10, 100, 1,000, 10,000 and 100,000 between which a 2,3,4,5 or 6-digit number could lie – please ask us about this as additional practice would be useful.

In Science lessons, we carried out an investigation to further our understanding of air resistance using paper helicopters. We have had some fascinating discussions about

gravity, and about two different objects falling to the ground when they are dropped at the same time. We watched the NASA video of the Falcon astronauts conducting Galileo's experiment on the Moon with a hammer and a falcon feather! We also watched a more up-to-date video of Professor Brian Cox conducting the same experiment in a vacuum chamber with no air. In Indoor PE this week, we performed counter balances with a partner, applying some of our forces knowledge! Year 5 adults have made home-learning expectations very clear to all Year 5 pupils and have shared these with parents and carers via the Open House Presentation which was also e-mailed out. Pupils know to complete at least 60 minutes of Maths Whizz per week, 4 Reading Journal entries AND at least one high-quality Reading Journal activity.

Year Six

This week in Year 6, it has been assessment week. We have completed assessments in Grammar, Punctuation and Spellings, Reading and Maths. The results of these assessments will be shared with parents at the upcoming Parent's Evening meeting, which will be held the week commencing 16th October 2023.

In English, we have been using the autobiographical book – 'Boy – Tales of Childhood' by Roald Dahl to inspire our writing. The outcome for this unit of learning will be to write our own autobiographical text. We explored the life of Roald Dahl and created a writer's toolkit to support us when writing.

In Maths, we have continued our learning on addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We have used our times table knowledge to find common multiples, investigated rules of divisibility and have explored prime numbers up to 100 and prime factors. In our Science unit on electricity, we have investigated what happens when you change the components of a circuit. We made predictions about what would happen if the circuit had 1 bulb and two cells or 2 bulbs and 1 cell and then created the different circuits to see the results.

In PSHE, we have discussed the changes and challenges in life that can impact on our mental health. In RE, we have explored the life of the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH). We also considered the importance of an Imam; how both are good role models not just in Islam, but for others too. In Computing, we have started to explore how we can work collaboratively on the same document whilst at different computers. This week in class, we have been listening to the music of ABBA.
